

Initial and subsequent visits for TBI

Does not include clinics


Does not include Minnesotans treated by border hospitals

TBIs were on a slow steady rise until 2020.


Total cases, MHA Data 2016-2022



The Data

TBIs were on a slow steady rise until 2020.

The reduction was mostly among emergency department treated TBIs while hospitalized TBIs remained steady.









TBI Patient Demographics: Gender



TBI Patient Demographics: Age




TBI Patient Demographics: Race

When adjusted for MN population by race, American Indian/Native Alaskan populations experience the highest rate of TBI among Minnesotans.





Population Adjusted cases, MHA Data 2016-2022





Causes of TBI

TBIs in Minnesota, 2016 – 2022 Mechanism Categories













Falls remain the leading cause of TBI for Minnesotans making more than half of all cases reported from 2016 through 2021.














TBI Visit Outcomes


Outcomes
